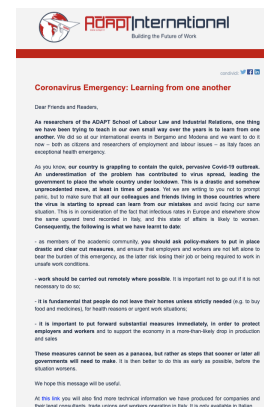

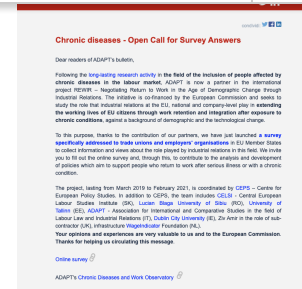

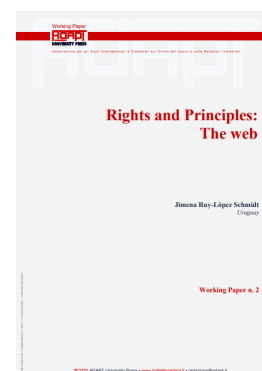

Started in February 2018, the first stage of the project 'The European model dialogue and the development of the solidarity between generations of workers' focus on 'over 65' and 'young workers in the finance sector'. Subsequently, through the generation gap is now complete.
